You are correct in what you have stated below regarding RSPs remaining in place until a student exits or graduates. In addition, DESE is working to put together resources and professional development opportunities for teachers beyond grade. We anticipate

these will be available to all LEAs beginning in the Fall of the 2024-25 school year. We will be making announcements through the weekly DESE Updates that are posted on Tuesday's, as well as all RPDCs will be promoting the resources and professional development options as they become available.

 - i. Separate out standards on each assessment so mastery of each can be recorded by student and class
 - ii. Standards based learning is our goal, so retesting is allowed for student to demonstrate mastery of priority standards
 - iii. Are your assessments aligned with the item specifications (DOK, ceiling)
- d. Benefitting future students
 - i. Analyze how it was taught and make suggestions for next year or next unit in which it appears
 - ii. Analyze individual question to make sure the questions are truly aligned to the priority standards
 - iii. Analyze our answer choices/rubrics to ensure a clear distinction on what is proficient

Greetings District Testing Coordinators,

According to State of Missouri procurement requirements, the Missouri Assessment Program (MAP) has awarded a contract for the Grade-Level and End-of-Course (EOC) statewide assessments to Data Recognition Corporation (DRC). DRC has been the vendor for the Grade-Level assessments since the 2015-2016 administration. The new contract includes the development, administration, scoring and reporting of Grade-Level and EOC assessments aligned to the Missouri Learning Standards.

No changes will be made to the content of the Grade-Level and EOC assessments at this point in time. However, as part of the transition to a single vendor, the fall 2023 administration of EOC assessments will be the last provided by NWEA on the Nextera platform. EOC assessments administered during the October 24, 2023 through January 26, 2024 fall test window will operate as they have in previous years.

The spring 2024 EOC administration will be provided by DRC on the Insight platform. District Test Coordinators are encouraged to work with their high school staff on training and preparation for the switch. The spring 2024 administration of the Grade-Level assessments will function as it has in previous years.

Later this fall and winter, DESE and DRC will provide in-person and virtual training opportunities, as well as recorded videos for the spring administrations of the Grade-Level and EOC assessments. Look for additional information about these trainings and the overall transition over the next few weeks.

 - Fulton uses i-Ready for K-5 and NWEA for grades 6-10. We added 9-10 this year for math and ELA.
 - Hallsville is good K-5 using iReady and teacher-created assessments.
 - South Callaway is incorporating this work with the DCI Common Formative Assessment practice profile.
 - ACT is good about coming out and looking at the data and giving PD for teachers

 - Versailles gives only required EOCs
 - Hallsville gives only required EOCs

- Fatima gives required, ELA 1 and Personal Finance to students getting embedded credit through Ag
